- 6. Applicant must meet the above criteria and submit his/her application to the Carriage House Foundation no later than Friday, April 7, 2023.

Should one of your students be selected, a member of the Foundation Board or a dealer in your area will try to attend graduation ceremonies, if possible, to make the presentation.
